PREFACE

The purpose of this guide is to provide the language teacher seeking overseas employment with a knowledge of what is presently available in his discipline. Additionally the contacts provided are intended to supply information about employment situations which will fulfill the specific needs of the teacher.

The guide has been divided into three sections, according to various conditions of employment. The individual sections are further subdivided according to geographical areas. The manner of subdivision should facilitate use of this material.

The first section of material gives specific information about public and private schools which educate the local populace. The contacts listed in this section provide the opportunity to teach foreign students. A few private schools which specifically do not teach the children of American government personnel are also included, as are the offerings of the Fulbright exchange and lecturing programs, due to their involvement with indigenous institutions.

Section two referred to as "Appendix A" is a listing of various American and International schools around the world. These schools provide a standard American education for the children of United States citizens living abroad. Teaching salaries in these schools are generally lower than in the United States but usually quite adequate, by local standards. All the positions in this section are at the elementary or secondary level.

The final section which is designated "Appendix B" is a compilation of additional major agencies that supply employment information or hire teachers. The section terminates with a listing of additional resource materials which may be consulted.

It is important to remember that this guide was developed during the summer months of 1971. The user should realize that some of the specific positions mentioned may no longer be vacant. The fluid nature of the foreign employment situation, however, means that many of contacts mentioned in this guide will presently have new positions opening.

All materials gathered during this study are on file at the M.A.T. Office, School for International Training, Brattleboro, Vermont. Due to the concise nature of this guide, it is suggested that the user consult this file for a more in depth understanding of the actual employment situation.
