

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### Preface

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#### PREFACE

The <u>a as in at Book</u> is a set of teaching materials for students of English as a Second Language (ESL). The materials have been designed to be used as a supplement to pronunciation work done in the classroom or, more specifically, as a supplement to pronunciation work based on Dr. Caleb Gattegno's phonic code charts (Fidels) for American English. Because of the the nature of the vocabulary included in this set of materials, it is recommended that they be used with high-intermediate or advanced students.

The <u>a</u> as in <u>at Book</u> has been designed as a self-review in pronunciation supplement for ESL students that does not require the use of a tape recorder or language laboratory. For these materials to be used effectively, the instructor must work with pronunciation with the student prior to their use.

The thirty-five crossword puzzles and 'sound columns' included in this set of materials are based on the twenty-three vowel sounds and the thirty-five consonant sounds which appear on the American English Fidels (1975 edition). All the words in each puzzle and sound column contain the same distinct vowel or consonant sound (phoneme). However, two, three, or four distinct phonemes occasionally occur in the same puzzle and sound column for convenience. Each crossword puzzle is accompanied by a set of clues which have been geared towards non-native speakers. The sound column accompanying each puzzle clearly shows the relationship between the different letter combinations (graphemes) for the same phoneme of the words used in that puzzle. All graphemes that appear on the American English Fidels (1975 edition) have been used in this set of materials. Many of these graphemes are unquestionably rare; however, they have been included in <u>The a as in at Book</u> to make the work complete.

#### INTRODUCTION

With a clear understanding of where a distinct sound is located in a word and how it is represented by characters, the student will be better able to sound out words and to discover their correct pronunciation himself. Thus, the primary reason for the development of the 'a as in at' materials is to clearly illustrate the relationship between the 408 graphemes and the 58 phonemes that exist in American English. This relationship is visually illustrated for each phoneme by a sound column which follows each crossword puzzle in this set of materials. The sound column, therefore, is the basis for the creation of The a as in at Book. The purpose of the crossword puzzle that preceeds each sound column is to guide the student in the selection of words containing the same phoneme but having distinct graphemes. In addition, the crossword puzzles add challenge, fun, and interest to a learning process that might otherwise be nothing more than a tedious listing of words. The improvement of dictionary skills and learning how a crossword puzzle can be used as a means of increasing one's vocabulary are secondary benefits of using these materials.

#### The Crossword Puzzles

As previously stated, the crossword puzzles are the means by which the student comes up with the words to be used in the sound columns. Because the puzzles have been designed for nonnative speakers, letters have been included in selected squares of each puzzle as additional clues in the selection of the words to be used. The puzzles have not been designed to stump or confuse the student.

#### The Clues

The clues have been carefully considered for the ESL student. They include synonyms, antonyms, definitions, fillins, simple grammatical transformations, and clues concerning the noun, verb, adjective, and adverb forms of words. The clues and their respective answers have been selected with the aid of The American Heritage Dictionary of the English Language1 in the paperback edition. The definitions used as clues for some of the more difficult words in the puzzles have been taken directly from this dictionary. The American Heritage Dictionary was selected because it is relatively easy for non-native speakers to understand. All but six of the words used in the puzzles and clues have entries in this dictionary. The six words that are not included have been written into the puzzles in their entirety for convenience. They are found in puzzles 19, 25, 27, 30, and 32. It is not necessary, therefore, for the student to consult additional sources in trying to solve these puzzles.  $\checkmark$  An underlined word in the clue means that another form of this word is the answer to that clue. For example, a clue reading, 'Someone who composes music,' indicates to the student that the answer to this clue is a form of the underlined word, 'composes'. 'Composer' is the correct answer. This underlining serves as an additional aid in selecting the answers to the clues. Also, it will help the student to become more aware of the form and func-


#### The Sound Columns

Once the student has completed the crossword puzzle for a specific phoneme, he is ready to complete the sound column. Each sound column is made up of a list of numbers and letters on the left, and a list of letter spaces and boxes on the right. The numbers refer to the corresponding numbers in the crossword puzzle and the letters refer to 'across' (A) and 'down' (D). Thus, the words from the crossword puzzle corresponding to these number-letter combinations are to be written into the letter spaces and boxes on the right. When the sound column has been completed, the boxed letters of the words listed clearly show the phoneme common to all the words in that column and the relationship between their distinct graphemes. The words in each sound column are, in most cases, arranged according to the number of letters in the graphemes of each word. Therefore, oneletter graphemes are at the top of the column, followed by twoletter graphemes, three-letter graphemes, etc.

#### To the Teacher

Because there are no directions included on the crossword puzzle and sound column sheets, it is recommended that the teacher supervise the student's first attempt at working with these. Initial understanding and success on the part of the student will insure continued success and enjoyment when using these materials again. The following points should be made very clear to the student before he attempts to complete the first crossword puzzle and sound column.

- 1. The crossword puzzle must be completed before the sound column.
- 2. The listed clues, the letters written into the puzzle, and the phoneme for that puzzle will aid the student in solving the puzzle.
- Occasionally, the first three, four, or more letters
   of a very difficult word are written into the puzzle.
   The student can use these initial letters to locate
   a limited number of words in the dictionary with the
   same initial spelling. Then by referring to the puzzle
   clue for that word, he can select the correct answer.
   In each sound column, the numbers and letters on the
   left refer to the numbers across and down in the re spective puzzle.
- 5. All the boxed letters in the same sound column have the same sound.


